Town of Oak Bluffs









Located on the island of Martha's Vineyard in Massachusetts the town of Oak Bluffs was originally named "Cottage City" in 1880 and then changed in 1907 to Oak Bluffs, reflecting the developing community and oak groves on the bluffs overlooking Nantucket Sound. Most know this town for their "gingerbread cottages" constructed in the 1800's. Today you can find a thriving historical district and downtown lined with picturesque houses and period dated street poles topped with a variety of luminaires. where many find themselves spending summer's in the sun. Various Spring City light poles and luminaires line the many streets of the town adding to the experience of feeling like you went back in time. Combining modern LED lighting with the classical style of the 40–60s these light standards bring the best of technology and historical appreciation














In the heart of Milton, MassDOT and city officials set out to create new avenues of transportation for pedestrians and vehicles alike. The Joseph Manning Community Park, surrounding streetscape and roadways were revitalized with improved signaling, pavement, ADA accessibility, improving mobility for all. Spring City worked with local engineering firms and MassDOT to provide new dark sky LED lighting, complete with our Crossfire Optical System and Coolcast roof to ensure minimal uplighting, keeping the lighting distribution to the surrounding ground and not the sky above.







Designed by Charles Brigham and built in 1892 the Fairhaven Town Hall was given to the town by Henry Rogers, a wealthy industrialist and businessman. This high Victorian gothic inspired hall even includes granite trim quarried from various Massachusetts towns. In 1981 the town hall was added to the National Register of Historic Places and has remained well preserved till this day. As part of the restoration and preservation efforts Spring City Jefferson luminaires and hancock poles were added surrounding the building. This assembly was commonly seen as a gas lit piece, with the arm providing a place for the lamplighter to place his ladder while lighting the lamp each evening.












The John Weeks Bridge opened in 1927 to carry pedestrian traffic between Harvard Business School's newly built Allston campus and the Business School's former home in Cambridge. Not only is it a popular vantage point from which to enjoy the Head of the Charles Regatta, but the light poles also represent a perfect example of Springs City's custom capabilities. East Bay Bike Path is part of the 3,000 mile East Coast Greenway connecting Maine to Key West, FL. The use of the Harrisburg Baltimore Spring City Luminaire accomplished a stylistic historical luminaire that complements the architectural appeal of the Washington Bridge, while adding technological LED advancements, providing superior return on investment, and added safety for path users.









The town of Swampscott MA lies 15 miles northeast of Boston and is home to Revere Beach, America's first public beach!

This welcoming seaside community is a classic example of northeastern architecture with bright, multicolored houses and businesses.

To complete the town's look, Spring City Lechmere pendants mounted on Cambridge arms line the streets supported by steel poles with cast iron bases.

Apponaug Village, Historical District







Apponaug Village in Warwick, RI is the quintessential New England neighborhood. Located at the intersection of three of Warwick's primary streets and designated as the Warwick Civic Center Historic District. The Spring City Quality Hill fixture is the perfect aesthetic accoutrement to be nestled among City Hall, the public library, and other municipal building.















"The shot heard around the world" the Lexington Common is a national historic landmark and is where the first battle of the American Revolutionary War took place. Duluth luminaires illuminate the park and surrounding area, reminiscent of the gas-powered luminaires that were commonly seen in the Boston area of times past.




The Fore River Bridge spans the Fore River between Quincy and Weymouth, Massachusetts. You can find custom-made Spring City luminaires designed by the prominent lighting designer, Domingo Gonzalez, flanking both entrances of the bridge. Spring City worked with massDOT officials to provide this custom lighting solution for their bridge.













Spanning 1.2 miles across Providence's East Side Benefit Street is home to Colonial and Victoria era residential, institutional, and religious buildings. This street was originally planned to be destroyed and modernized in the 1950s but has since been turned into an outdoor museum with traditional decoration, furniture, and time relevant material in each house. Spring City provided "Providence" LED Luminaires to complete the historical accuracy and it make it truly seem like visitors have taken a step back in time.





Topsfield, MA is revolutionizing their downtown streetscape by using unique solar light poles to power their streetlighting. Spring City Augusta dark sky luminaries were chosen for this project thanks to Spring City's adjustable Symphonic LED system.


















Billerica has been long known as the "Yankee Doodle Town" because of its patriotic roots that date back to the Revolutionary War when a citizen of the town was tarred and feathered by British Soldiers. That event turned the term Yankee Doodle from a negative slur to a patriotic symbol. With heritage running so deep it would be hard to imagine anything else but the classic American style of the Yorktown lining the streets.

Anderson Memorial Bridge










The Anderson Memorial Bridge sits on the site of the "Great Bridge" built in 1662, the first bridge to cross the Charles River. During the 2016 rehabilitation project MassDOT turned to Speclines and Spring City to provide custom luminaires to suit their needs. By combining both preexisting tooling and custom banding we were able to create a one-of-a-kind luminaire to complete the project.











Located 20 miles north of Boston Andover MA is a small town most popularly known for Phillips Academy, one of the oldest and most prestigious boarding academies in the US. The town features charming New England scenery and a picturesque downtown with a mix of historic and modern buildings. As part of improvements made to the downtown area Spring City decorative LED luminaires and lamp posts were added to Park St, completing the streetscape and providing lighting to local businesses.





The Columbia pendant is a fitting style to adorn the streets looked over by the Soldiers and Sailors Monument since 1881. The monument was built to celebrate the bravery of local soldiers who died fighting in the Civil War. Peabody Square's recent relighting project helps to illuminate the historical significance of both the town and its citizens.







The Everett Northern Strand Community Trail is a vibrant multi-use path that stretches over 11 miles and across several communities in Massachusetts, providing a scenic and practical conduit for cyclists, walkers, and joggers. The trail not only provides recreation and transportation but also connects neighborhoods, parks, and local businesses, fostering a sense of community. Spring City luminaires, poles, and bollards are seen throughout the trail, promoting sustainable and active lifestyles while preserving the area's rich heritage.

















Jacob Scharf Playground is a result of Everett's initiative for renovation, development, and asset preservation. The playground aesthetically is a blend of new and old that encourage community development and fostering a healthy living environment. Spring City New Frontier Luminaires and Cambridge poles blend the park with the existing streetscape, creating a cohesive city look.
